Director's Note

From the Director's Chair:

Directing "Forum" has been a lot of fun. Which is the reason I wanted to direct this show in the first place – to have fun! Interestingly, this is the reason Stephen Sondheim originally wanted to write this show. "Forum" is a true throw-back to burlesque & vaudeville entertainment. Mistaken identities, crazy chase scenes & men in drag – this show has it all. No deep-thinking necessary. "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum" is the first musical in which Stephen Sondheim wrote both the music and lyrics. After "West Side Story", (Sondheim wrote the lyrics) opened on Broadway his friend Burt Shevelove commented on the lack of "low-brow comedy" on Broadway and mentioned a possible musical based on Plautus' Roman comedies. Sondheim called a friend, Larry Gelbart, (creator of M*A*S*H* and screenwriter for "Tootsie") to co-write the script. The result is a show with non-stop laughter (or, that is to say, if you don't like this joke don't worry because there is another a few seconds away). "Forum" is the type of musical that allows the actor to "chew the scenery". This is escapist entertainment in its purist form and a great way to forget your troubles for a couple of hours. I mean, you have to love a show that has an opening number that makes it clear what the show is all about.

All of that said, for me the true joy in directing a show like this is to watch this talented cast cut loose. They have been a breeze to direct and I am truly excited to share the results with you, the audience. Being able to do this with a veteran production staff I have worked with many times makes it even more satisfying. My Choreographer / Assistant Director Jenny Small and Music Director Sue Laney (with her terrific orchestra – a true bonus for any community theater) make me look like a much better director than I really am (but I'm still happy to take the credit). I have lost count how many great sets Andy Weibel has designed & built for me (hopefully there will be many more). A big thanks to my stage manager, Sarah Hurwitz and technical folks Sam Myers & Keith Emigh (all of whom I have relied on in previous shows). New to my production staff is our talented costumer Joyce Leahy (the results speak for themselves so I obviously will be calling on her again). Thanks also to our props person, the always reliable Terayai Robinson. I can't list everyone responsible for bringing this show to life but would be remiss if I failed to say thank you to Imagine Productions for making this show possible. I am honored and grateful they chose me to serve as Director for "Forum".

So, as the opening number tells us, get ready to enjoy a "Comedy Tonight". With this versatile & imaginative cast you can never tell what will happen!




Brandy Jo Burke (Panacea) is excited to be apart of A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum and to be participating in her first Imagine Production show.




